Definition

Life Cycle



Definition: A series of stages that a plant or animal goes through during its lifetime. A butterfly's life cycle would include the following stages: egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, adulthood.

After hatching https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IGOwvqj_8S0 the eagle babies (eaglets) are taken care of by both parents and remain in the nest until about three months of age. The nest (called an aerie) is lined with soft materials and the sides are 2-3 feet deep to prevent the chicks from falling out. The eaglets themselves are built for survival. Let's take a closer looking at their special features.
